


Ma tä' ma mora' ma mora' ma öf se'ia!

Kafetauof returned to Noa'tau and left the leadership of Ista to his stronger brother, Väenuk who stayed with their mother.






After the race, their father, King Fonmanu, told them to return to Noa'tau.

There once lived two brothers who were the sons of King Fonmanu of Noa'tau and their mother who hailed from the Kingdom of Tonga.


