Here's a fun action song to enjoy singing with tamariki. It helps them learn the names of their body parts.

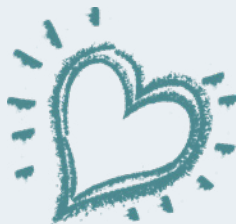
Upoko pakihiwi, turi, waewae
