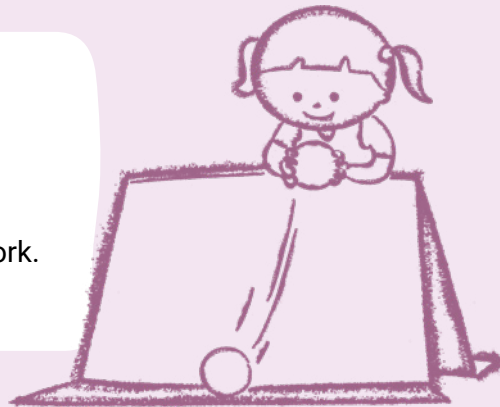
**At home playing outside,

- Problem solving, safety, stability and balance.

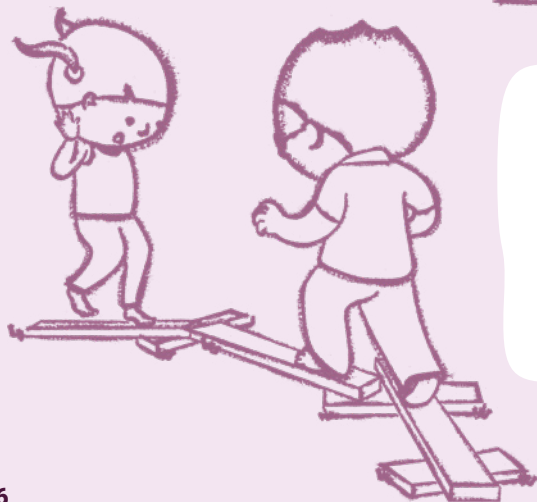
Playing hide-and-seek,

**At home with water play, I can learn from...**

Using a hose and containers

- Measurement – volume, capacity, depth, weight.
- Flow – speed, dams.
- Change – maroke/mākū (dry/wet), muddy, slippery, light, heavy.
- Tools – funnels, sieves.
- Horoi (washing) – clothing, toys, windows, cars.



Playing in the rain

- Weather – kapua (clouds), puddles, the water cycle, evaporation.
- Language – float, sink, splash, empty, full.



Taking a bath or shower

- Self care.
- Bubbles, pouring and spraying.
- Floating and sinking.
